President's Message

On behalf of the Louisiana Orthopaedic Association Board of Directors, it is my pleasure to invite you to this year's annual meeting from March 14-16 at the iconic Roosevelt/Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New Orleans. This change in venue will offer a luxurious stay in a beautiful historical New Orleans Hotel. The Roosevelt will also provide a great space for education and meeting up with old friends- the Sazerac Bar is always a good time. Of note, a percent of each room reserved will directly benefit the LOA. Dr. Brian Godshaw, our program director, has developed quite an exciting meeting that now includes a "Debate Your Mentor" section where you will see "the trainee" debate their one-time trainer. We had over 80 research paper abstract submissions and it will be interesting to hear

about research going on in our great state. To round out the educational format, we are very excited to have a star-studded lineup with our three guest speakers.

Dr. James "Jim" Bradley is a clinical professor at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine and a world-renowned sports medicine surgeon. Dr. Bradley has been the head team orthopaedic surgeon of the Pittsburgh Steelers for 33 years. He is the past president of the Herodicus Society, NFL Physician's Society, and the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine (AOSSM). He graduated from Georgetown Medical School, University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine residency in orthopaedic surgery and completed his training in sports medicine at Kerlan-Jobe Orthopaedic Clinic in LA. Dr. Bradley has published 159 peer reviewed articles for medical journals, 57 medical textbook chapters, and has 411 guest lecturer presentations under his belt. He plans to give us some insight into what he has learned as an NFL team physician.

Dr. Lisa Lattanza is the chairman of Yale Department of Orthopaedics and Rehabilitation. She is a hand and upper extremity surgeon known for her treatment of posttraumatic and congenital reconstruction of pediatric and adult elbow problems. She is a world-renowned leader in patient-specific 3D surgical planning for deformity correction and led a team in performing the first elbow-to-elbow transplant (a very interesting story that hopefully she will tell). She was one of the co-founders for the Perry Initiative, recipient of the AAOS Diversity Award, and was the past president of the Ruth Jackson Society. Dr. Lattanza obtained her medical degree at the Medical College of Ohio, orthopaedic residency at the University of Missouri Kansas City, and completed her training in hand surgery at the Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York. Dr. Lattanza also completed a six-month fellowship at Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for children in Dallas. Bring your most complex elbow cases her way and she will have an answer!

Dr. David Teague is the chairman of orthopaedic surgery at the University of Oklahoma Medical Center. Dr. Teague specializes in trauma care and served two disaster relief tours on the US Naval ship Comfort in the aftermath of the earthquake in Haiti. He is past president of the Orthopaedic Trauma Association (OTA) and actively takes calls at the state's only Level I Trauma Center. Dr. Teague graduated from University of Texas Southwestern Medical School in Dallas, completed his orthopaedic surgery residency at the University of Oklahoma College, and finished his training at Harborview Medical Center in Seattle.

The final piece of our meeting will be to introduce our new lobbying team of three, the 1812 Group. Don Caffery, Jason Harbison, and Tyler Daniel will be there to present their lobbying focus, what is new for this upcoming session, and answer any questions from members.

I know this will be a great meeting and look forward to seeing everyone at the Roosevelt!

Presidential Guest Speakers



James P. Bradley, MD

Dr. James P. Bradley is a globally recognized American Board-Certified Orthopedic surgeon and leader in sports medicine research and treatments. An educator and innovator, he has contributed to advancements in surgical techniques and patents for medical devices. Dr. Bradley continues to support sports medicine education and research currently, as a Clinical Professor of Orthopedic Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. In this position, he encourages and mentors Orthopedic Surgeons in their fellowships, imparting valuable medical knowledge, experience, and surgical techniques. His expert medical knowledge and experience has resulted in Dr. Bradley being

published in 159 peer-reviewed articles for medical journals, 57 medical textbook chapters, 22 chairmanships, 37 grand round presentations, and 411 guest lecturer presentations as of 2023.

Most recently, in 2023 Dr. Bradley was awarded the George Rovere Education Award by the AOSSM. He was honored by his peers in 2022 to be inducted into the AOSSM Hall of Fame. In 2021 he was recognized by Expertscape.com as a world expert in shoulder instability for his career-long research and education. He was recognized as a Distinguished Alumnus of the Pennsylvania State University in 2020. In 2019, Dr. Bradley was awarded the Arthur C. Rettig Award for excellence in academic research given by the National Football League Physicians Society (NFLPS) and is on Castle Connolly America's Top Doctors of 2019. Honored in 2017, Dr. Bradley was named in the "Becker's Spine Review: 65 Orthopedic Surgeons Recommended by Orthopedic Surgeons."

Dr. Bradley has been the president of the Herodicus Society in 2010, the NFL Physician's Society, and the American Orthopedic Society for Sports Medicine (AOSSM) in 2020.

In 2016, he was included in *Orthopedics This Week's* list of top knee surgeons entitled "16 Standout North American Sports Knee Surgeons: 2016." In 2015, Dr. Bradley was also named in their top list of North American shoulder surgeons in 2015 and was recognized by his peers as one of Becker's Spine Review's "Top 55 Surgeons in the Country."

In February of 2014, he was honored with the Jerry Hawk Rhea Award from the NFL for being a dedicated and outstanding NFL Team Physician. Over the years, Dr. Bradley has been distinguished with several national and local honors including, "America's Top Doctors," and "Top Sports Medicine Specialist in the Pittsburgh Region." He is considered one of the top Sports Medicine doctors in the country, and is consistently recognized by his peers and patients. In 2013 Dr. Bradley was named one of the Top 19 U.S. Sports Medicine Specialists in the United States in *Orthopedics This Week*, published by RRY Publications LLC. He has also been included as one of the "65 Outstanding Shoulder Surgeons and Specialists" in Becker's Orthopedic, Spine, and Pain Management Review.

As of 2023, Dr. Bradley has been the Head Team Orthopedic Surgeon of the Pittsburgh Steelers for 33 years. He has worked closely with the NFL and is a past president of the National Football League Physicians Society. For three decades now, Dr. Bradley has played a significant role in the lives and careers of the NFL's most spectacular players. Since 2018 he has been a second opinion physician for the National Basketball Association (NBA) given his sports medicine expertise. He has treated thousands of athletes over his career and with his surgical talent they have returned to the sports they love. Given his passion for medicine and sports, he was invited to become part of the Herodicus Society and even served as president for a term. In addition to this work, he is currently Chairman of the National Football League's Medical Research Peer Review Committee and also serves on the NFL Injury and Safety Panel Committee. He has served as the president of the AOSSM and NFL Physicians Society. At a local level, he also is a consultant to local high school and collegiate athletes.

Presidential Guest Speakers



Lisa L. Lattanza, MD, FAOA, FAAOS

Dr. Lisa Lattanza is Chair of the Department of Orthopaedics and Rehabilitation at the Yale School of Medicine. When she began her appointment at the Yale School of Medicine in September 2019, she became one of only two female chairs of orthopaedics in the U.S. at that time. Prior to coming to Yale, she practiced for 20 years at the University of California San Francisco. She served as the Chief of Hand, Elbow, and Upper Extremity Surgery and Fellowship Director. She was also Vice Chair of Faculty Affairs.

She obtained her medical degree at the Medical College of Ohio (now the University of Toledo College of Medicine and Life Sciences). She did her internship at the Harbor-UCLA Medical Center, completed her residency in orthopaedic surgery at the University of Missouri Kansas City, and did a fellowship in hand surgery at Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons/Roosevelt Hospital. She completed additional fellowship training in pediatric hand and upper extremity at Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in Dallas, Texas. She joined the faculty of UCSF in 1999.

Although Lattanza treats all conditions and traumatic injuries in the upper extremity. She specializes in post-traumatic and congenital reconstruction for pediatric and adult elbow problems, treating patients from around the country and across the globe. She is a world-renowned leader in patient-specific 3D surgical planning and technology for deformity correction. She utilized her expertise in this area when she led a team to perform the first elbow-to-elbow transplant in the world in 2016, transplanting a patient's left elbow into his right arm to give him one functioning extremity after a devastating accident.

Lattanza's research interests include 3D surgical planning for deformity correction, elbow instability and other post-traumatic elbow conditions in children and adults, and diversity in orthopaedic surgery, specifically the underrepresentation of women.


At Yale, she recently started the first ever degree, Masters of Science in Personalized Medicine and Applied Engineering, specifically aimed at training the next generation of medical students and engineers to understand, develop and implement the most advanced use of 3D and 4D technology (including AR, VR, AI, bioprinting and additive manufacturing) for patient-specific medical and surgical treatment.

In 2009, she co-founded the Perry Outreach Program to increase exposure of high school girls to orthopaedic surgery and biomechanical engineering. Now known as the Perry Initiative, the program is named after Lattanza's mentor, Jacquelin Perry, MD, who was one of the first women orthopaedic surgeons in the country. It began with 18 high school girls in San Francisco and has now reached over 17,000 high school, college, and medical students across the country.

Lattanza's research has shown that young women who complete the program are applying and matching to orthopaedic surgery residencies at a rate of about 24 percent, compared to the national average of about 14 percent. Her goal is to reach 30 percent within the next three years.

Lattanza has received numerous awards for both her clinical care and outreach efforts. She received UCSF's Compassionate Physician Award in 2013 and Exceptional Physician Award in 2014, the Jefferson Award for Community Service in 2014, and has been ranked by her peers as a Bay Area Top Physician for multiple years. She was chosen for the prestigious American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons Diversity Award in 2021. In addition to her other leadership roles, she served as president of the Ruth Jackson Orthopaedic Society in 2017 and is active in the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, the American Society for Surgery of the Hand, and the American Orthopaedic Association.

Presidential Guest Speakers



David C. Teague, MD

Dr. David Teague earned his medical degree from the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School in Dallas, TX in 1988. He completed his orthopedic surgery residency at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center College of Medicine in 1993, followed by his fellowship training in musculoskeletal traumatology at Harborview Medical Center at the University of Washington in Seattle, WA in 1994. He joined the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine Department of Orthopedic Surgery in 1994 and set about encouraging the system to establish an

American College of Surgeons (ACS) verified Level I trauma center. That designation was achieved, and OU Medical Center remains Oklahoma's only ACS Level I center.

Dr. Teague was named the Don H O'Donoghue Professor and Chairman of Orthopedic Surgery in 2007. He continues to serve in this position. The department growth during his tenure has been steady and sustained. Every subspecialty is covered with fellowship-trained surgeons. The department serves as a primary and tertiary referral source for many. The residency program has grown in size and quality, now training seven residents per year in the only allopathic orthopedic training program in Oklahoma. Trainees come from all over the country to join the program, with many especially from the South, lower Midwest and Southwest.

Dr. Teague's professional contributions coalesced around the Orthopaedic Trauma Association (OTA) and the ACS Committee on Trauma (COT). He served as committee member and chair, at large board member and in the presidential line of the OTA which entailed a 5-year board membership including his presidential year 2018-2019. He served two 3-year terms on the ACS COT. He participated in most of the Extremity War Injury (EWI) Symposia in Washington, DC, and still serves as the civilian advisor for the 2024 EWI. Dr. Teague served on two American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS)/OTA Haiti disaster relief tours with the US Naval Ship Comfort. He was appointed in 2010 to the AAOS/OTA Disaster Preparedness Project Team to develop national recommendations for disaster relief and mass casualty preparedness. He participated with a multi-disciplinary work group from ACS, COT, OTA, SOMOS and other trauma professional organizations designed to improve the collective response structure for domestic readiness and education. He was an orthopaedic trauma representative at the roll-out of the NASEM Zero Preventable Death Report in November 2016. He represented the OTA at both ACS Firearm Injury Prevention Summits in Chicago, IL.
